

PEARSON SUCCESSNET TIPS

To get your user name and password, register using your access code.

If you have not established a user name and password, you will need to set up your account with

To Add a Class:

- Go to My Classes and Groups. Select "Manage Classes" underneath the Success Tracker Icon.
- Select "Create a class/group" (top, right on your screen).
- Choose a group name for your class (jv2010).
- Under "Select Available Products," be sure to check enVisionMath Premium CA G3, Mathematics Online Student Edition, and Math ST Premium 2009 CA Bilingual G3. *This is important because it will allow you to assign lessons and tests.*

To Add Students:

- Go to "My Classes and Groups." Under the blue "Roster" bar, select "View" for your new class.
- Select "Add a student."
- Since this is our third year, many students are in the database. When you type in the names, Successnet may say that this student is enrolled. You have a few ways to go. You may select their name from last year and they will keep their password from last year, or you can make a change.
- If you select the same information they had last year, you can go back to change the grade level after all have been selected. There is an "edit" roster key.
- I decided to change my students' user names and passwords to something consistent for me to remember.
- Example - User name: last name + first initial (vargasj) password: room07

To Assign Tests:

- Go to the Home page.
- Next to the purple "Home" tab, pull the cursor over the "Content" tab to reveal other selection choices. Select "Tests."
- Make sure that the "Select from" bar shows Math ST Premium 2009 CA Bilingual G3.
- Go to "Select test type."
- To begin the year, I use "Beginning of course." This is a diagnostic for beginning skills of the students' current grade level.
- Click on "Go," and you will get a screen to enroll your students for the test. You may change the start and end dates provided for you.
- I also select "Diagnosing Readiness." This will give you a list of the 20 Topic Readiness assessments. Think of it as an online "Review What You Know." It will give you valuable information on the needs of your students by item number. It will also automatically assign appropriate Reteaching and enrichment exercises for individual student needs.

To Assign Lessons:

- Go to the Home page.
- Scroll down to the bottom to "Mathematics" for your grade level (it is on the left side; your text cover is the icon).
- Click on the Premium icon.
- Select the Topic you wish (Topic 1).
- Select the lesson, and then select "Assign." This should take you to an assignment menu where you can select the beginning and ending dates.
- I spoke to Pearson about assigning a full Topic at a time. They said we can assign only one lesson at a time; there is no way around it.
- If you are having trouble getting the lessons assigned, try turning off your pop-up blocker.
